Major Inghram had the honor of guiding John Muir to the summit of Mount Rainier. It was on that trip, that Camp Muir was founded and named. We have focus on climbing, skiing, winter backcountry, first aid, and Guye Cabin. We do canoe and kayak trips, bike rides, participate in conservation issues. Our Club is able to include everyone, from the very young, to novices, to the most experienced. All of us here today have a common unique, special bond that holds us together through the years, and makes our great Club special! Mike

MINUTES

Financial Report - Doerte Mahanay distributed and reviewed financial report. 2005 continued with a strong financial status. Many WAC/Guye Cabin improvements in the last three years. Annual cabin fees decreased slightly, while daily/night use is up. All classes overall profitable, except Teliski class due to cancellation because of lack of snow. Donations are up. Mem-

bership was noted as still the most import source of income. Regarding expenses, two new furnaces have been purchased for the cabin, and expenses remain to cover monitoring for sprinkler system. The online bulletin is saving significant money, cutting copying and postage costs (and switch from printing at Kinko's to Costco has added to savings). Utilities are up at cabin. Insurance expenses, 13.5%.

Climbing Class Report - Recognition was given to 2005 Basic Climbing Class Cochairs George Snelling, Christie Fix and Murray Kahn; and also to Intermediate Class Cochairs Andy Toyota and Todd Gitz, with Todd Lee and Maria Lee. The upcoming basic class will be cochaired by Mica Schonbeck, KP Pryde, and Kris Arnold.

2006 Telemark Ski Class Report - The club is seeking individuals to re-invent this class, given that there is pressure from the Mountaineers and other clubs offering same type of instruction. Jeff Wright, Mike Back, Randy Oakley and Megan Nedzinski volunteered to run this years telemark class.

Nordic - Eli Holmes, with husband Karel, said they would offer clinics in nordic and skate skiing for adults in the club.

Guye Cabin Report - Upgrades accomplished at cabin reported as follows; carpet has been installed at stairs, garage door replaced, ping pong room renovated, outside stairs redone, rock wall built, kids area created off living room, and sprinkler system and monitoring installed (strategically placed smoke alarms still to be added). 3 new furnaces being added at this time.

Guye Cabin Land - 2 acres of forest land (former ski hills) have been added to the existing 44 acres of Open

Space. A PBRS (Public Benefit Resource System) application was submitted in August and approved in September to add the two acres. Through a Forest Stewardship Program under the PBRS, a significant tax deduction (10%) will be given with our forest management plan put in place under the PBRS.

Guye Cabin Furnace - Old unreliable oil burning furnaces are in the process of being replaced with electric (electric choice made after research and in consideration of volatile value of oil). The electrical service had to be upgraded to accommodate new furnaces. Les Sargent and Dave Mitchell have put in huge amounts of time and effort and job is almost complete.

Guye Cabin Security Alarm - this will be activated soon, more information to follow.

Membership - There were 279 renewals this year, almost exactly the same as 2004. Our new members were down a bit due to low snow last season and cancellation of classes, but percent of renewals is up.

Bulletin - Online bulletin has saved money on printing and postage.

Federation of Western Outdoor Clubs (FWOC) - Reece White attended to represent the WAC. The FWOC is comprised of 52 groups like the WAC (a charter member) who banded together in the '32 to increase their legislative power to have an impact on environmental and land use issues.

Winter Parking - The survey is complete, and Rosemary Daszkiewicz created an easement document and sent it to Sahalie for review. Sahalie responded by offering to sell the WAC the strip of land (.3 acres).

Research must be done into what fair market value will be, and Sahalie's approval must be gained. With this pending purchase, there will be no need for a new parking lot. The winter parking plan for this year is; we park on the WAC side of the road, we pay \$200 to Sahalie as traditionally done, a WAC sticker must be in place on the car or a

WAC parking permit (copies obtained from the cabin) placed on the dash.

Changes to the Bylaws - approved by vote.

A committee comprised of Dorte and Mike Mahanay, and Lynne Miller reviewed the current membership structure and developed the following proposed changes.

- 1) Eliminate the 1/2 year membership.
- 2) Move membership renewal to calendar year.
- 3) Change to #2 Schedule A, in all cases full initiation fee must be paid if membership lapses.
- 4) The 60 day grace period for renewals will change to 30.
- 5) Add multi-year memberships, 2-5 year renewals will get discounts.

These changes were discussed, and it was noted that for 2006 renewals they will be good for 1 1/2 years to take everyone to the new calendar year schedule. It was also noted that the fiscal year for the WAC will not change. The above proposed changes to the Bylaws were all approved by vote.

WAC Website - To maintain website now costs \$30 per month, and Sim Larkin reported that by switching providers a lower monthly rate can be achieved (\$10), but this will require a reprogramming effort. It was asked that if anyone

is interested in volunteering their time to research options and do the necessary reprogramming to please contact Sim.

Cabin Hosts - There are those that would like to re-institute Cabin Hosts for winter weekends again. There was general discussion of host responsibilities, including being point person to answer questions and opening and closing the cabin.

Donation Items for Cabin - Items needed, refrigerator, microwave, kid's bookshelf.

WAC Upcoming Events - The installation dinner will be Nov 11th, and the Snow Dinner will be Dec 10th.

Appreciations - Mike Mahanay acknowledged Les Sargent for all his help with the cabin and being instrumental in getting things done, and also Dave Mitchell for his efforts as chief furnace installer and brownie maker, and for many years of input.

CABIN

Winter 2006 Parking procedures - Sahalie is expanding their side parking, which will allow us to have 10-15 WAC specific spaces this winter. In my talk with Ray Devries from the Gymnastics Society, they were quite clear that we must follow the procedures below. I urge everyone that uses the Cabin in the winter to make sure that you understand where to park. Email or call me if something is not clear.

We will park on our side only and South of the A frame fire hydrant

We must put the signs out

Friday evening, and return them Sunday afternoon.

The area in front of the A frame fire hydrant, and North must be kept clear for the Summit shuttle bus.

If we need more spaces we must park at the N end of Sahalie side only.

Sahalie reserves the right to request additional parking on New Years or their Carnival in April. All WAC cars must have decal or parking pass displayed

Friday around noon they will plow, so we must have the entire parking area cleared at that time.

Everyone must be aware of the procedures

Everyone must help monitor and police the parking

There is a Sahalie cell phone contact for any issues, Gary Odegard . Mike will be the WAC contact.

We must not allow the public to park in our spaces, or in the Shuttle bus area.

Sahalie should not park on our side. If they do we must be very nice, and call the cell contact.

Guye Cabin Combination has changed

- As it does every Annual Meeting we have changed the combination to the lock at Guye Cabin. (Thanks Dave Mitchell!) If you are a cabin opener simply give Mike, Dave, or Bill a call to get the new combination.

Do not give the combination out, ask everyone to go through us so we can confirm they are still an active member, and are signed off to open and close.

Although the Cabin has been open most every weekend this year, and will be for sure every weekend over the winter, our Club is unique in that

the Cabin is available to virtually any member on their own that wants to use it, as long as they are signed off as to the various procedures and protocols. To get signed off just volunteer in some aspect of the Club for at least one day.

The next opportunity to learn the opening/closing procedures of Guye Cabin and get "signed off" will be at the Annual New Snow Dinner on December 10 prior to 4 pm.

Cabin Host - This year, due to popular demand we are reinstating the Cabin Host for the winter. Folks will sign up for a weekend to be the Host of the Cabin for that weekend. For example, I might sign up for the first weekend in February. I would have a vegetarian theme potluck on Sat night, arrange a night ski after dinner, and also be go to person for questions, ensure everything runs smoothly and the cabin is cleaned and closed on Sunday. If you are interested in a particular weekend sign up now! I'll keep the list.

GUYE CABIN ANNUAL FEE

Guye Cabin fees are only \$10.00 per night per WAC member (which includes two days), \$15 for guests, or \$4.00 for day use. Kids under 13 are free! There is no parking fee at this time. You can also pay an Annual fee! \$70.00 per person, \$100.00 for two, or \$120.00 for three or more family members. This is a great way to not have to worry about sending in your fee every weekend to the WAC Treasurer.

Plus the added benefit of knowing that YOU are helping to support Guye Cabin! Couples which only include 1 WAC member must pay the guest fee for the spouse/significant other/friend.

When you arrive at Guye Cabin park only on the WAC side of the road south of the Standpipe! Sahalie has an easement on both sides, and allows us to park only on our side, or the very far north end of their side. In the Winter, if you are the first arrival, put out the No Parking Signs, Pylons and yellow tape.

Be sure to sign in the Cabin Log Book, pay your fees, introduce yourself to everyone, and check with the Cabin Host to see if any chores need to be done. We always need to shovel snow to keep a path open to the cars, off the stairs etc.) Please follow the rules while at the Cabin. (no smoking, no alcohol, quiet time 10 PM to 7 AM, eat and drink only in the dining room and kitchen) Also, before you leave restock firewood, clean a room of the cabin so it is even nicer than you found it, or sweep a floor. Take the recycles and trash home if you can. (There is no garbage service) Mike
