Remote Wilderness First Aid Class - Sat / Sun November 13 / 14

Thanks to our WAC instructors- Scott Calhoun, Laurie Rich, John Sanford, Eileen Sliwinski, Jon Shields, Pat Beurskens we are again able to offer our annual first aid class. Both the class and our instructors get better every year!

WRFA is a 16 hour first aid course for the wilderness traveler. Wilderness and Remote First Aid is designed for people whose jobs, volunteer activities or favorite activities take them to remote wilderness settings where Emergency Medical Services responders may be an hour or more away.

Major portions of the course are designed to be taught outdoors. CPR/AED is required.

The course covers

- Head (Brain), Neck and Spinal Injuries
- Wounds and Wound Infection
- Hypothermia
- Heat-Related Emergencies
- Allergies and Anaphylaxis
- Altitude-Related Illnesses
- Bone and Joint Injuries
- Burns

This course will held at Guye Cabin and begin at 8:00 AM on Saturday morning and continuing through Sunday evening approximately 5:00 PM. Be prepared for fall unpredictable weather, as a good portion of the class will be held outdoors, come rain, snow, or shine. You'll need to bring snacks and special diet requirements. The WAC and Kristine Fyfe will do lunches and dinner on Saturday.
