As you may or may not have heard, the WAC created a Risk Management Committee back in March to help us confront and mitigate the risks inherent in the activities we love to do. The RMC's mission is to support, review, and provide oversight to the risk management planning, implementation, and performance of WAC programs and activities to maintain program and operational safety. Our intent is to provide a system of checks and balances to effectively prevent and respond to incidents of risk while sharing responsibility, thus promoting an organizational awareness and culture of safety in the WAC.

It has been a busy few months for research and planning in the RMC, and you may notice some changes both big and small as we strive towards creating tools for and encouraging a culture supporting increased safety. We've started with embracing the things we already do well, such as our Emergency Response Plans and the WAC Way, and added processes where we needed to improve. You may have already seen increased diligence about making sure we have relevant medical information

about all parties on a trip so that they can be properly cared for in the event something goes sideways. The Incident Report Form that was created (and diligently filled out by instructors!) has already given us a look into the medical incidents, injuries, and near-misses we see as a group. We're doing well, but will of course look to improve in coming years. (One tip: avoid being under or creating rockfall!) You can see the full report on the RMC's website, listed below.

In the coming months, we'll be looking for ideas, support, and occasionally organizational effort on several undertakings. All of these are first and foremost useful ways to keep us safe, but secondarily they are necessary to for our biggest initiative: to obtain insurance to protect those involved in the WAC-sponsored classes. Some of the things we'll be looking to further develop include required first aid training for instructors, WFR or higher first aid trained instructor on all class outings, regular equipment tracking and maintenance, a formal crisis management plan, and an overdue trip procedure. Wilderness Remote First Aid Course Nov 1-3



Be prepared to assist your ski companions or hiking and climbing partners in an emergency by taking the fall 2013 edition of the WAC Remote Wilderness First Aid Course! In addition, we are looking for folks who will continue their education by taking the WRFA instructor course and can come back and teach for us.

Spend two weekends reviewing learning how to identify serious medical conditions in time to perform life-saving first aid. You will review American Red Cross Standard First Aid and practice techniques to manage conditions such as orthopedic trauma, thermal injury, and physiologic deterioration due to high altitude. A rational approach to the evacuation of one or more injured persons is addressed both in the classroom and in field scenarios. WRFA certification is awarded on completion of the course.

This year, the basic two-weekend WRFA course will be held on November 01/02/03. The cost, which includes books, supplies, and lodging for the second weekend at Guye Cabin is \$120.
